

## LEGAL NOTICE

NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN that the Borough Council of Conshohocken Borough, Montgomery County, PA, will conduct a public hearing on October 17, 2018, at 7:00 p.m. at Conshohocken Borough Hall, located at 400 Fayette Street, Conshohocken, PA 19428. The purpose of the public hearing is to receive comment and public testimony regarding (a) a petition filed with the Borough to vacate (i) a portion of West Hector Street, and (ii) a portion of Forrest Street (collectively, the “Streets”), and (b) a proposed ordinance entitled “AN ORDINANCE OF THE BOROUGH OF CONSHOHOCKEN, MONTGOMERY COUNTY, COMMONWEALTH OF PENNSYLVANIA, VACATING STREETS.”

The petition received is a request by the owners and equitable owner of certain properties which abut the Streets, requesting that the Borough Council vacate the portion of the Streets abutting their lands. In summary, the proposed ordinance would vacate a portion of the Streets. The exact location of the portion of the Streets that would be vacated is depicted on a plan attached to the proposed ordinance (the “Vacation Exhibit”). A list of all owners abutting the portion of the Streets to be vacated is also attached to the proposed ordinance. The ordinance would be recorded in the Office of the Recorder of Deeds of Montgomery County, if approved.

After the hearing at the public meeting, the Borough Council will consider enactment of a proposed ordinance to vacate the Streets.

A copy of the petition to vacate streets and the full text of the proposed ordinance, along with the Vacation Exhibit, are available for inspection by any interested party at the offices of Conshohocken Borough, 400 Fayette Street, Suite 200, Conshohocken, PA 19428, the Montgomery County Law Library, Montgomery County Courthouse, 2 East Airy Street, Norristown, PA 19401, and the Times Herald, 410 Markley Street, Norristown, PA 19401, where copies of the proposed Ordinances may be obtained for a charge not greater than the cost of copying during normal business hours. All interested parties are invited to attend the hearing.
