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A SNEAK PEEK AT BOROUGH EVENTS IN 2026

The Borough of Conshohocken is ready to put the “Play” in “Live, Work, Play, Grow” with a full calendar of exciting events lined up for 2026. From beloved traditions to reimagined favorites, there’s something for everyone all year long!

Spring Starts with a Splash of Green

The fun kicks off when the **Montgomery County Saint Patrick’s Day Parade** turns the Borough green on **Saturday, March 14 at 2 p.m.** This marks the 20th time the parade has marched down Fayette Street since 2006!

Before the parade steps off, lace up your sneakers for the **Conshy Classic 5K**, hosted by the Conshohocken Fire Department, starting at 12:30 p.m.

The Green Theme Continues in April

The Conshohocken Environmental Advisory Council hosts its fourth annual **Greenfest** on **Saturday, April 18** in Mary Wood Park. Enjoy fun exhibits and interactive learning opportunities on composting, tree planting, native plants, green technology, renewable energy, electric cars & bikes, and more.

Art, Cars, and High-Speed Action

The **Simon’s Heart Conshy Classic Bike Race**, hosted by QCW, returns on **Saturday, June 6**—and in 2026, it’s getting a fresh new look as part of the **Conshohocken Arts Festival and Car Show**.

The reimagined course will take racers from Borough Hall to East 5th Avenue past Mary Wood Park, down Hallowell Street to East 4th Avenue, over Harry Street, right onto East 3rd Avenue, and back up Fayette Street. Races begin at 9:30 a.m.

The **Arts Festival and Car Show** will once again stretch the length of Fayette Street and will be extended by an hour, running from 11 a.m. to 5 p.m.

Lace Up with Flyers Legends in June

On **Sunday, June 14**, the **Philadelphia Flyers Alumni Walk, Run, Ride** returns to the Borough. Supporting Flyers Alumni Charities, this event gives participants and spectators the chance to meet Flyers legends while enjoying a walk, run, or bike ride up Fayette Street to Sutcliffe Park and back. The Flyers Alumni will also offer family-friendly activities in the courtyard of Hotel West and Main.

July Brings Two Conshohocken Classics

Early July belongs to two cherished Conshohocken traditions: Fireworks and the Soap Box Derby!

- The **Fireworks Display** lights up the sky on July 3 at 9:15 p.m.—and it’s going to be the biggest one yet in celebration of America 250.
- The **Conshohocken Soap Box Derby**, a Fourth of July tradition since 1951, races down Fayette Street starting at 8:30 a.m. on July 4.

Summer Nights & Cool-Off Fun

Summer means music, water, and community fun:

- **Seven Summer Concerts** will take place on **Thursday nights at 7 p.m.**, from July 9 through August 20.
- The Conshohocken Fire Department will host three **Sprinkler Nights** to help everyone beat the heat:
 - o Thursday, June 25 – Sutcliffe Park
 - o Thursday, July 30 – Mary Wood Park
 - o Tuesday, August 4 – Mary Wood Park
- Residents can also hang out with the Conshohocken Police Department during **National Night Out** on **Tuesday, August 4** in Mary Wood Park.

Funfest Gets Even Bigger

Funfest, Conshohocken’s biggest party of the year, returns on Saturday, September 19 from noon to 8 p.m. In 2026, the celebration expands to **Ninth Avenue**, bringing even more vendors, food trucks, family activities, and—of course—fun!

- **Halloween Parade** – Saturday, October 17

- **Menorah Lighting**, hosted by the Chabad of Lafayette Hill – December


The year wraps up with a cozy community favorite: the **Holiday Drive-In Movie** on Saturday, December 5.

ENGINEERING

The Borough is required by the Pennsylvania Department of Environmental Protection to enforce a Stormwater Management Program designed to reduce the discharge of pollutants from the public storm sewer system to help protect water quality per the requirements of the Clean Water Act and Pennsylvania Clean Streams Law. The public storm sewer system includes storm sewer inlets, piping, swales, catch basins, channels, and even roads. Pollutants include soil, garbage, sewage, pet waste, and nutrients found in fertilizers.

As part of this Program, the Borough submits annual reports to the Pennsylvania Department of Environmental Protection detailing how it complies with the following Minimum Control Measure categories: Public Education and Outreach on Stormwater Impacts; Public Involvement/Participation; Illicit Discharge Detection and Elimination; Construction Site Stormwater Runoff Control; Construction Stormwater Management; and Pollution Prevention/Good Housekeeping. The Borough also enforces a Pollution Reduction Plan to reduce the amount of sediment entering Plymouth Creek through the public storm sewer system.

How can you help?

The most important thing to keep in mind is that the public storm sewer system does not get treated - anything that enters the Borough's system eventually reaches the Plymouth Creek or Schuylkill River. This includes litter, pet waste, leaking oil, lawn fertilizer, pesticides, and car cleaning soaps. When taking care of your lawn, consider mulching lawn clippings to provide natural fertilizer and reducing the use of commercial fertilizer and pesticide use or toxicity. Use only as much water as you need when watering your lawn and outdoor plants, since water that runs off sidewalks and roadways carries pollutants into the public storm sewer system.

If you notice water flowing in the public storm sewer system during dry weather, this could be a sign of a problem. Please report any concerns to Conshohocken Borough at 610-828-1092.

ZONING SERVICES

The rules for each zoning district are outlined in the Borough's Zoning Ordinance, which determines the specific land uses that are permitted in each district, such as residential, office, commercial, or industrial. The code also outlines the dimensional standards for each district, such as maximum building and impervious coverage, minimum building setbacks, and maximum building heights.

Zoning Permits:

The Zoning Ordinance includes regulations governing off-street parking, patios, walkways, signs, fences, and accessory structures. Zoning permits are required for these.

The application for a Zoning Permit can be found on the Borough's website, www.conshohockenpa.gov. The permit fee is a flat fee of \$50.00, and permits require two weeks to process for completed applications.

Zoning Hearing Board Applications:

The Zoning Hearing Board conducts public hearings at the request of developers and residents seeking zoning relief from a provision of the Zoning Ordinance via variance or special exception. The Board meets when an application and/or zoning petition has been submitted with all applicable documentation and fees. The Zoning Hearing Board reviews applications on a case-by-case basis and makes determinations based on the Borough's Zoning Ordinance.

Meeting dates, changes, and/or cancellations are posted on the Borough's website.

Short-Term Residential Rental (Transient Lodging)

Per the Conshohocken Borough Code, the rental of a residential property for a period less than 30 days constitutes transient lodging and is NOT permitted in

Play It Safe: Spring & Summer Bicycle Safety Tips

With warmer weather on the way, it's the perfect time to enjoy a ride. Whether you're biking around town or exploring the Schuylkill River Trail, keep these safety tips in mind to help ensure a safe and enjoyable experience for everyone.

- Always wear a helmet. Nearly 75% of all bicycle-related deaths involve a head injury—protecting your head is essential.
- Make yourself visible. Wear bright or reflective clothing to help drivers and other trail users see you.
- Equip your bike properly. Your bicycle should have:
 - o A red rear reflector
 - o A white front reflector
 - o Amber reflectors on each side
 - o Pedal reflectors
 - o A horn or bell
 - o A rear-view mirror
 - o A bright headlight which illuminates the rider's path for 500' for night riding.

Ride Smart

- Follow traffic laws, signs, and signals. Cyclists must ride with the flow of traffic, just like motorists.
- Know your route. Familiarize yourself with the roads, intersections, and traffic signals along your planned path.

On the Schuylkill River Trail

- Obey trail signage. Montgomery County trails have their own rules. Cars have the right of way at road crossings—slow down and proceed with caution.
- Keep right. Allow faster riders, runners, and other trail users to pass safely.
- Stay alert. Consider removing one earbud so you can hear approaching cyclists, pedestrians, and vehicles.

Special Notes for Trail Crossings

At the five trail crossings at Cherry, Poplar, Ash, Harry, and Oak Streets, vehicles have the right of way due to active train tracks and automated crossing gates.

Please remember:

- Motorists must continue through these intersections without stopping on the tracks.
- Pedestrians and cyclists must stop at the posted stop signs on the trail before entering the intersection.

- Thermometers

- Medications from businesses or clinics
- Hydrogen peroxide
- Ointments or lotions
- Liquid medications
- Aerosol cans

Safely disposing of medications helps prevent misuse and protects our environment.

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FIRE SERVICES

DEPARTMENT STAFF

The Fire Services Team works closely with Licensing & Inspections, Emergency Management, the Police Department, and Narberth Ambulance to further ensure the protection of life and property of our citizens, visitors, and businesses.

The Borough of Conshohocken employs three full-time career firefighters, who also serve as the Borough's fire inspectors, along with part-time firefighters. Fire inspectors perform annual inspections on fire alarms and fire protection systems in new and/or existing commercial buildings within the Borough of Conshohocken.

State and local fire codes require that every business undergo regular fire inspections. Fire Services for Conshohocken also consists of two volunteer fire stations--Washington Fire Company No. 1 and Conshohocken Fire Company No. 2. Both fire companies operate under Station 55 and provide volunteer firefighting services to the Borough of Conshohocken.

Home & Fire Safety

The Conshohocken Fire Department has noticed an increase in electrical house fires due to the misuse of power strips. It is important to use power strips correctly. Never use multiple extension cords in one outlet. Overloading outlets, circuits, and extension cords by plugging too many things into one area can cause an electrical fire.

Avoid potential fires by following these safety tips:

- Check to ensure that all electrical cords are in good condition and are not broken or cut.
- Clean the lint from your dryer after every use.
- Check to ensure that all plug outlets are safe and do not feel warm when you touch them. If they are warm, call an electrician.



Free Smoke Detectors & Installation

Free smoke detectors are available to property owners at Borough Hall (400 Fayette Street, Suite 200, Conshohocken, PA 19428). Supplies are limited to three (3) smoke detectors per household.

Residents requiring special accommodations may arrange to have their smoke detectors delivered and/or installed at no charge. Please contact the Fire Chief directly to arrange.

Carbon Monoxide Alarms

- Install carbon monoxide alarms on each level of your home.
- Make sure carbon monoxide alarms are less than 7 years old.

Fire Prevention Education & Events

Fire Services offers a variety of educational opportunities and events to raise awareness about fire safety. Conshohocken's Fire Services Team provides on-site fire safety education year-round to the community at no cost.

We encourage schools and businesses within the Borough of Conshohocken to contact the Fire Chief to learn more or to schedule an on-site visit today!

During the summer, Fire Services hosts three Sprinkler Nights to allow you to beat the heat and hang out with your firefighters. In 2026, Sprinkler Nights will be:

2026 Holiday Solid Waste & Recycle Collection Schedule

When a holiday falls on a Saturday or Sunday, it is observed on the following Monday. When your trash and recycling collection day falls on a holiday, your trash and recyclables will be collected on **Wednesday**, and yard waste will be picked up on **Thursday**.

Trash & Recycling Carts

Borough-approved containers must be used for all residential trash and recycling unless other arrangements have been made and approved by the Public Services Department. Trash and recycling cans must have 2 wheels, a metal lift bar, and attached lid. Unapproved containers will be tagged for no future pickups until the residence comes into compliance.



Trash Collection Rules and Regulations

- There is a limit of four (4) cans/bags per household per pick-up (200 pounds maximum)
- Each can/bag is not to be heavier than 50 pounds.
- Needles, syringes, lances, and other sharp objects should be placed in a metal container with a secure lid so as not to be a hazard.
- Each household is permitted to dispose of one (1) large piece of furniture or bulk item per month with regular trash. This includes sofas, box springs, plastic siding, TVs and all electronics. All other bulk trash or bulk metal collection must be arranged through the Borough of Conshohocken by calling 610-828-1092.
- Please place your cans/bags at curbside on your property no earlier than 5 p.m. the night before and your cans must be removed from curbside no later than 7 p.m. the day of collection.
- No construction debris, carpet, clean-outs, or move-outs unless approved by the Licenses and Inspections Department. Please call 610-828-1092.

Conshohocken Is Single Stream Recycling

Single stream recycling allows all your recyclable materials to be placed into one recycling container. The best part is you do not have to separate them! Hence, we get the term **'Single Stream Recycling.'** Residents will see trash trucks collecting recyclables. Rest assured recycled materials will go to the recycling facility, NOT the trash-to-steam plant. Recycling carts should be left out before 7 a.m. on collection day, at the front edge of your property or nominated collection point.

Yard Waste Collection Rules and Regulations

Yard waste stickers are available at the Borough office to convert your old blue recycle bin into a container for yard waste disposal.

All residents must participate in the Borough's recycling programs by separating their recyclable material from their regular trash. Yard waste is recyclable; therefore, the separation and collection of this material is mandated by the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania and Conshohocken Borough.

- Weeds, leaves, brush, and plants should be placed in biodegradable paper composting bags. Please, no trash in these bags.
- Each bag should not be heavier than 50 pounds.
- Tree branches under five (5") in diameter, not exceeding five (5') in length, are to be securely tied into bundles and should not be heavier than 50 pounds.
- Christmas trees; No decorations, tree stands or plastic tree bags.
- Please place your bags, and/or bundles at curbside on your property no earlier than 5:00 PM the night before.

PUBLIC SERVICES CONTINUED

Stormwater Management

Precipitation from rain or melting snow that flows over the ground creates stormwater runoff. Surfaces like streets, driveways, and sidewalks prevent runoff from being absorbed into the ground. Stormwater runoff flows into storm drains or directly into bodies of water.

This runoff can pick up chemicals, debris, dirt and other pollutants that will contaminate our water. It is a common misconception among residents that stormwater is treated before it reaches the waterways. This assumption is false, as everything picked up by the runoff empties into our natural waterways.

The dedicated Stormwater Management team has been actively inspecting, cleaning, and repairing storm drains and inlets. This work allows for a healthier stormwater system and increased safety measures, such as using only bicycle safe grates. The repair and replacement of stormwater structures will be an ongoing task. This work will be aided by a new GIS system, which will help the team map out the underground assets and pipelines with the ability to monitor their condition. The street sweeper will also aid in this effort, as it goes out multiple times a week to clear debris from roadways that could otherwise end up clogging storm drains.

HOUSING REHABILITATION PROGRAM

The Borough of Conshohocken's Housing Rehabilitation Program has funds available from the Pennsylvania Department of Housing and Economic Development HOME Program and Community Development Block Grant Program.

The Housing Rehabilitation Program has been in existence for over five decades and has assisted hundreds of Conshohocken homeowners bring their homes into code conformance, enabling them to live more comfortably and safely. On average, the Program completes four (4) to seven (7) properties per year.

Roof repair, window and door replacement, electrical upgrades, sidewalk repair, as well as handicap accessibility, are some of the items the Program can provide to eligible single-family homeowners.

The Program is a four-year Deferred Loan Program that declines by twenty-five percent each year.

EMERGENCY MANAGEMENT

The Department of Emergency Management supports the development and implementation of the Borough of Conshohocken's emergency operation plans and standard operating procedures in large-scale incidents and events. Emergency Management exists to support our first responders and all emergency personnel. The department consists of members from the Police Department, Fire Department, Narberth Ambulance, Borough Administration, and Public Services, in combination with our Borough Council and Mayor.

The department has been undergoing continued training with the County, State, and Federal Emergency Management teams to ensure preparedness for your safety in all incidents and events. This past year, this training included attendance at the Emergency Disaster Incident Training Symposium (EDITS), where staff members heard from leaders across the country who have experienced public disaster incidents firsthand.

Through permits, inspection, and enforcement, the Licenses & Inspections Department is responsible for the administration of Borough, State, and Federal Codes and Ordinances that pertain to Building Construction, Zoning, Land Development, Housing, and Property Maintenance.

Licenses & Inspections respond to property maintenance complaints concerning issues such as lawn maintenance and snow removal. They are also responsible for the inspections of building construction, rentals and resale, and property maintenance. Conshohocken's Licenses & Inspections Department handles 100% of the required building construction inspections.

Licenses & Inspections works closely with the Police, Fire, and Public Services Departments to ensure the health and safety of the Borough residents.

Frequently Asked Questions

Do I need a permit for...?

Any structural changes may require a building permit for residential and commercial properties. If you are ever uncertain, contact the Borough at (610) 828-1092 and ask a Building Inspector if a permit is required for your project. Be prepared to provide a detailed scope of work for the project and identify the property as residential or commercial. Change in use may require zoning permits and approval.

Am I responsible for maintaining the alley behind my house?

Yes. The property owners on each side of an alley are responsible for maintaining up to the center of the alley for the width of each respective property. This includes keeping the alleyway free of issues such as potholes, grass, weeds, and trash. Weeds on the alley side of your fence are part of your property, and you are responsible for trimming and spraying.

Why does the Borough need to inspect the home I'm selling?

Governed by the Transfer of Real Estate and Real Estate Certification Borough Ordinance, anyone selling a property in the Borough is responsible for certifying that there are no violations of any Housing, Building, Zoning, Fire, Health, and Safety Codes. L&I performs an inspection and records any apparent violations. All violations are required to be corrected prior to settlement, or the responsibility to correct any violations may be transferred to the buyer, who will have 12 months to complete the work.

Can the Borough tell me where my property line is?

The Borough cannot independently verify property lines on behalf of property owners. Property owners are encouraged to engage a Professional Land Surveyor to prepare a site plan and physically set corner markers. This information is useful for property improvements such as fences and garages, laying out additions to the primary structure, and satisfying property line disputes. None of this can be accomplished without physically apparent monuments or property corner pins.

When is a Use and Occupancy Permit required?

Per the Borough Code of Ordinances, property owners are required to obtain a Use and Occupancy Permit each time any of the following occurs:

- Use and occupancy of any building or structure that is altered or erected.
- Change in the use and/or occupancy of any building or structure.
- Use of land or change of use thereof.
- Change in use and occupancy of any non-conforming use of extension thereof.

- Change of tenants in any building or structure.
- Ownership of a building is transferred

Am I responsible for maintaining sidewalks and curbs?

Yes. The property owners are responsible for maintaining their sidewalks and curbs, this includes removing all tripping hazards. Sidewalks and curbs are part of the Use and Occupancy process.

Residential Rental License Permit

A rental property is any dwelling or any building containing units for which the owner derives income or any other consideration from persons residing by a written or oral contract, lease, sublease, or agreement.

Rental property has an occupancy that occurs for a period of 30 days or more. Full Residential Rental Permit License information can be found on our website under Resources | Borough Code of Ordinances | Chapter 11 | Part 2.

The rental of a residential property for a period of less than 30 days constitutes transient lodging and is not a permitted use. Therefore, the operation of transient lodging constitutes a Zoning Violation.

- All owners of rental properties in the Borough of Conshohocken are required to submit a rental application on or before April 15 of each calendar year for the issuance of a residential rental license permit. A separate application is required for each rental property. Application Renewals will need to be completed each year.
- At the time of application, submit all applicable fees and provide a list of tenants, as well as a completed Borough earned income tax form or an affidavit attesting to the fact that the tenant is not employed.
- The tenant list shall be updated any time that a change of tenant occurs during the term of the residential rental license permit. Failure to update the tenant list will constitute a Violation.
- Every application will have an initial property inspection completed by a Borough Rental Property Inspector. Bi-annual inspections will be conducted thereafter.
- Residential rental properties in the Borough of Conshohocken are required to have house numbers installed and maintained on the front and rear of dwelling structures. The house numbers required by the ordinance must be installed before a residential rental license may be issued or renewed.

Conshohocken Free Library

A Branch of Montgomery County-Norristown Public Library

The library lawn will be in bloom from spring through summer, thanks to our "pollinator patch" native garden beds. These were installed last year with the help of Community Canopy, Friends of Conshohocken Parks, Friends of Conshohocken Free Library, Girl Scouts of Eastern Pennsylvania, Conshohocken Community Garden, and volunteers in the community. It was a wonderful coming together of Conshohocken residents to improve the library. That service is still needed with volunteers to water and weed the beds. The library will plan a mulching and clean-up event in the spring, and information will be posted on our website, conshyfreelibrary.org.

To continue our stewardship efforts, we are partnering with Valley Forge Audubon Society and Bird Safe Philly under the Flight Path grant program with STAR Library Network. The library received grant funding to provide programs about bird migration and what we can do in our community to make buildings and yards safer for our feathered wildlife. Since birds will be attracted to the library lawn's pollinator patch, it only makes sense to provide a safe environment for them.

Did you know birds are believed to be ancestors of dinosaurs? You can learn that and more with our summer reading, "UNEARTH A STORY." We'll have 8 weeks of programs starting in June for all ages. Monday afternoons will feature a "make and take" craft in the community room. On Wednesday evenings, you can join us for family-friendly programs. More special events will be planned in between. Anyone can join our reading challenge, log minutes in Beanstack to qualify for rewards, and enter for raffle prizes.

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
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
